The AAFC has resumed engagement with the International Air Cadet Exchange Program hosting an Australia-wide tour for overseas partner participants last month.

Participants from the UK, USA, Belgium, Republic of Korea and New Zealand visited a variety of locations and were involved in many activities including a tour of RAAF Amberley, a Qantas deep maintenance facility, the Australian War Memorial, Temora Aviation Museum, flew in one of our AAFC Diamonds and experienced Sydney and the Blue Mountains.

In return Cadets and six adult volunteers from the AAFC will travel to those participating countries during the same period. One of the highlights of the visit was the Chief of Air Force dinner where Cadets met and dined at the ADFA Cadet mess with Chief of Air Force, Air Marshal Robert Chipman.

CADET AIR EXPERINCE IN CANBERRA

Over 120 Cadets from Canberra recently had the opportunity to have a Cadet Air Experience (CAE).

The team from Elementary Flying Training School (EFTS) Richmond, flew four Diamond DA-40 NG aircraft to the Fairbairn RAAF base and over two days ran continuous flights and circuits of the Capital.

The EFTS has a goal of giving every Cadet an air experience, no matter where they are and that may be in the fleet of the AAFC aircraft or Powered Service Providers.

Cadets in their first year of membership, with parental consent, have access to at least one non-instructional aviation experience flight, at no cost to the cadet.


Participants receive a formal pre-flight briefing, then fly as passengers where they partake in and observe a complete flight experience.

A team from the 2 Wing took part in the 3-day Chief of Army Cadet Team Challenge 2023 at the Kokoda Barracks, Canungra OLD.
